Module selection process	Students will be sent a link to the specific department's webpage to go through the rulebook and identify modules that they would like to take part in during their exchange period. The number of modules and/or credits that the student needs during their exchange is determined as per the agreement between the two universities and/or by the home institution. As students will be enrolling as Non-degree seeking students at the UFS, they are permitted to take as many or as few modules as they choose. The current course curriculum can be used as a reference as there will be no major changes. We would like to ask you to kindly advise your students to start the course approval process as soon as possible and not to wait until the last moment.
