Application Procedure

- 1. Once Macquarie University is ready to open Exchange applications, a nomination link will be sent to partner universities
- 2. The partner universities will then nominate their students for an Exchange program at Macquarie university
- 3. Once the student's nomination has been approved by Macquarie University, the student home university will send the application link to apply for the Exchange program
