Coaching and professional development - master Biomedical Sciences

Specialisations

In 2020-2021, specialisations were introduced in the Master BMS to further improve the structure and depth of the programme. Specifically, the course offering in the first periods of the BMS programme have been subdivided into 7 specialisations, which the students can choose from. The specialisations on offer are:

- 1. Immunology and host defence
- 2. Clinical human movement sciences
- 3. Epidemiology
- 4. Health Technology Assessment
- 5. Drug Safety and Toxicology
- 6. Molecular Medicine
- 7. Medical Neuroscience

Specialisation coordinators

In the master BMS, 7 specialisation coordinators (SC) will take responsibility for the content and coaching of students within each specialisation. The specialisation coordinator is a new role in the Master BMS, which will replace the current role of institutional mentor with additional tasks and responsibilities. In addition to coaching the students, the SC represents and evaluates the specialisation and monitors/ensures the coherence, depth and structure of the specialisation. For the free specialisation students can choose the SC who is most suited to guide them during the master (taking into account the topics he/she wants to include).

The SC provides support and guidance to enable the student to carry out his/her learning process within the specified timeframe. The SC will monitor progress of the student with respect to his/her specific learning goals, ambitions, interests and results in the educational components and give feedback. The SC can advise the student regarding his/her choices for courses, electives and internships. The SC stimulates the student to reflect on his/her learning process and to improve him/herself. In particular, the SC will act as mediator should conflicts arise during any phase of the program. Individual reflection issues can be discussed and confidentiality will be maintained if requested by the student.

Coaching and professional development: aims

- 1. To provide support and guidance by enabling students to carry out their learning process within the specified timeframe and help them in designing their individual master's programme
- 2. To guide students in their professional development and academic skills
- 3. To make students aware of their unique selling points and how to communicate these to others

Coaching and professional development: guidelines and time schedule

Individual sessions

During the master's programme, there will be five compulsory individual meetings with the SC; more meetings are possible if requested by the student. Although the content of the meetings will depend on the student's needs, several subjects need to be discussed in these meetings. This will help the student to make the right choices in designing his/her individual master's programme. Students will need to prepare for each individual meeting by writing a Master & Career (MCP). In this MCP two major topics will be described each time:

- Designing your own master programme
- Preparing your professional Profile

The MCP will develop during the Master. The proposed themes for the successive conversations (see appendix 1) have overlap. It is permitted to repeat certain elements from a previous MCP and to further improve or extend it as your insights about yourself and your future plans develop. This way each MCP builds on the previous versions.

It's important that your professional profile gets more and more concrete towards the end (including a cv and LinkedIn profile) to prepare yourself for a professional career and applying for a job. The student is responsible for arranging the meetings and hand in the required documents one week before the meeting. Every meeting the study plan (including appendices as internship plans and descriptions of individual education) will be discussed.

Note: Internship plans have to be discussed with the SC before sending it to the Board of Examiners
via Osiris Case!

5	Second semester of the second year

Group activities

The specialisation coordinator will also organise several group activities during the master BMS, for community building and meeting each other, but also for information concerning your specialisation, how to find an internship etc.

Appendix 1. Individual Reflection Report

For each individual meeting, the student needs to be prepared by writing an individual Master & Career Plan (MCP). In this MCP two major topics will be described each time:

- 1. Designing your master's programme
- 2. Preparing your professional Profile

The MCP will develop during the Master. The proposed themes for the successive conversations (see below) have overlap. It is permitted to repeat certain elements from a previous version and to further improve or extend it as your insights about yourself and your future plans develop. This way each MCP builds on the previous versions.

It's important that your professional profile gets more and more concrete towards the end (including a CV and LinkedIn profile) to prepare yourself for a professional career and applying for a job. Each MCP should contain between 400 – 1000 words, and should discussed with your Specialisation coordinator. Please send this MCP one week before the meeting, and include your study plan, and other important documents to discuss (for example an internship plan).

- Internship plans have to be discussed with the SC before sending it to the Board of Examiners via Osiris Case!


