1. Procedure

Steps **Information** Send abstract Send¹ in abstract **2 weeks** before first submission. Check the **guidelines** below prior to submission. Submissions not complying with guidelines will receive an immediate 1st submission return of these, which may delay or prevent consideration of your article in the print edition. Your thesis is reviewed by a senior reviewer (Professor / senior Review process researcher) and a student reviewer (CNS Master student). Upon decision of the Journal committee on theses to be published, you will Selection be informed via email on their decision (accepted/rejected) and suggested changes of your thesis. 2nd submission Resubmit thesis after required adjustments. Your thesis will be published online, and if informed earlier, also in the Publication printed edition.
