Academic calendar

Autumn semester 2026: 31 August 2026 to 17 January 2027

Spring semester 2027: 18 January 2027 to 6 June 2027

Examinations are arranged throughout the year with no fixed examination periods. Each course ends with an examination which can be of various types. Break over Christmas depends on each specific course schedule. In-class participation is normally not required after Christmas.

Language of instruction

English

Full time study load

30 credits (ECTS) per semester. Courses are normally worth 15 credits. Students choose two 15-credits courses each semester. One week of full-time studies equals 1.5 credits. The workload is 40 hours per week, including lectures, reading assignments, seminars and independent studies.

General information about our law courses and the Swedish Law Programme

The law courses in English offered to exchange students are electives given on year 4 of the Swedish Law Programme. The Swedish Law Programme of 4,5 years leading to the Swedish Master of Laws Degree (in Swedish: *Juristexamen*) is the standard law programme in Sweden. The degree is required for professions such as that of a judge, attorney at law and prosecutor. The Law Programme is mainly taught in Swedish but some electives are held in English.

The standard law programme consists of compulsory courses taught over a period of 7 semesters. After this, in their fourth year, students can choose from app. 60 electives. Approximately 20-25 of these are given in **English** and are open to both foreign exchange and Swedish law students. Foreign exchange students who are proficient in Swedish may also apply to attend the courses taught in Swedish but there is subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed. Most courses end with a written examination.

Exchange programme: Semester/Full Year

Kindly note that we have new nomination and application deadlines starting in 2026. Instructions will be sent in due time.

Nomination deadline

For autumn semester (or full academic year): **1 April**

For spring semester: **20 September**

Unless stated otherwise in our agreement, we ask you to nominate your yearly quota of students equally between the autumn and the spring semesters.

Application

All students must officially be nominated by their home university to be eligible for an exchange at the Department of Law. After the nomination is received, the students will be given access to the application.

Application deadlines

For autumn semester: **15 April**

For spring semester: **1 October**

Application material required

Online form including copy of the student's most recent **Transcript of records in English.**

Academic requirements	All our courses are on an advanced level. Your students are therefore required to have studied at least 120 credits in law (i.e. 2 years of fulltime studies) in order to take our courses. Please know that students who join us during the 1 st semester of their 3 rd year might struggle with a knowledge gap if they have no previous studies in the particular area of law that they choose to study here in Stockholm. While we only require 120 ECTS, your students will preferably have at least 2,5 years of fulltime studies within law before joining us.
Language requirements	Students whose mother tongue is not English are recommended to have at least a level of B2-C1, or equivalent of an overall IELTS score of 6.5 or an overall TOEFL score of 100 internet-based. We do not need to see the test results but ask all our partners to make sure their students have this level before nominating them to us.

Course information

Course catalogue	Course catalogue (law) The page will be updated as soon as information is available. Please note that the list might be subject to change.
Swedish language course	Swedish language courses on different levels are offered for free by the Department of Swedish Language and Multilingualism to all incoming exchange students. More information about language courses are given during the Welcome Activities .
Non-law courses	Your students are expected to study law fulltime, as per our agreement. Exceptions may only be granted to students enrolled in a double-degree at home and upon request from the coordinator at the home institution.
Course Attendance	Please note that all our courses have mandatory active attendance . This means that students are expected to come to their classes well-prepared and ready to actively discuss the contents of the day's lecture/seminar/etc. For optimal class dynamics it is therefore very important that your students meet our language requirements and are prepared for this style of teaching.
Transcript of record	Students can issue an official transcript of records through our student portal. This comes with a verification code (bottom of the page). If you require a hard copy, please state so in the nomination online form.

Summer programme

Your law students also have the opportunity to attend our [SULaw's Summer Programme](#), our short exchange programme of 2-4 weeks. The dates of the Summer programme 2026 are **21 June – 18 July 2026**. **The exact nomination, application and payment deadlines are set every year and will be communicated in due time.**



Nomination procedure	Nominations will open in January with a deadline mid-March . Partners will receive details regarding the nomination process as well as the course schedules in January/February. All students must be officially nominated by their home university to be eligible for the programme.
Application & Payment	The application and course selection deadline for students will be in early April . The course selection will be confirmed shortly after. Payment will be due later in April , after the results of the course selection are communicated to students.
Language requirements	Students whose mother tongue is not English are recommended to have at least a level of B2-C1, or equivalent of an overall IELTS score of 6.5 or an overall TOEFL score of 100 internet-based. We do not need to see the test results but ask all our partners to make sure their students have this level before

nominating them to us.

Courses

Our summer courses are in law only. Depending on the year, we offer courses on basic, advanced level or both. For access to the advanced level courses, your students have to have 2 years of fulltime studies in Law. For courses at basic level, the academic requirement is one year of fulltime study at the university level.
