Registration	Exchange students who have completed the International Humboldt Online Orientation Program (IHOOP) can register as early as April 25, 2022. It is highly recommended for students to complete IHOOP early and be ready to register in late April to ensure they receive the classes they are interested in taking. Additionally, early registration allows them to communicate with faculty before the faculty leave mid-May.

	Exchange students receive priority registration but classes may still fill up. If a prerequisite is required for a class the student will need to contact the faculty to ask for a 'permission number' to allow them to register. The exchange student should be prepared to show a syllabus or class description that meets the scope of the pre-requisite. Unless a student is enrolled in a class a place in that class cannot be guaranteed.

English language proficiency	TOEFL is not required for students from exchange partners. Students whose first language is not English must send a letter from an English language professor verifying the student's language capabilities and stating that they can participate fully in classes taught in English.
Airport/Bus Station pick up	Students must arrange their own transportation from the local airport (code: ACV) or from the Greyhound/Amtrak bus station to housing. The College of Extended Education & Global Engagement cannot provide airport pickup service.
