In the academic year 2018-2019 the specialisation International Economics & Business (IE&B) of the Master's Economics will be replaced by the specialisation International Business (IB). International Business is a combined specialisation offered by Economics and Business Administration. See table 1 for the course outline.

Students who started their programme <u>before 2018-2019</u> could choose to finish the 'old' specialisation International Economics & Business. Table 2 lists all the courses of the 'old' programme in the first column. In the second column you will see the possibilities you will have in 2018-2019 to finish the programme you have started with before 2018-2019.
