1) Entrepreneurial Economics Bachelor of Arts - International (EEBA)

Focus on agricultural economic issues: international trade, policy development, preservation of natural resources; sustainability of environmental resources, agribusiness marketing, and micro-finance. LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION AND OTHER INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

Approximately 80 different subject classes are offered by the Faculty of Economics in English; visiting students may separately petition for permission to take classes offered in English by other KU Faculty, such as Business Administration; Education; Humanities; Engineering; Agro Industry - Food Science; Agriculture; Forestry; Fisheries.
