Scope

The form is meant to assist the assessment of the master thesis and presentation of the TWM master candidates. The form shall be <u>completed by both assessors</u> at RU and UDE, based on their <u>national grading systems</u>, i.e. Dutch grades at RU and German grades at UDE.

Important: Re-calculation from one system to another shall be done by the examination officers at both universities only!

Registration of master thesis

Irrespective of whether he/she is the first or second assessor, UDE assessors need to ensure the candidate's registration of his/her master thesis using the <u>master registration form</u> (available online at the TWM website). The registration needs to contain the names of the candidate and both assessors, a working title, the starting date and the signatures of the candidate and the assessor at UDE. At UDE, the submission deadline for the master thesis is equivalent to the indicated starting date plus 6 months, according to UDE's examination regulation. Submissions after this deadline shall be accepted only based on prior notification and approved request. Written requests need to be submitted two weeks before the deadline at the latest.

Responsibilities

The <u>first assessor and his/her university</u> are responsible for the overall assessment procedure and for the timely exchange of grades between both universities. Prior to assessment, the first assessor shall ensure with the exam officer at the respective university that the concerned student meets all <u>formal</u> requirements at both universities (study fees, enrolment, sufficient credits for graduation).

Procedure

The first assessor shall contact the second assessor and compile both assessors' assessment forms for final grading. Deviating assessments can be discussed bilaterally, to achieve a harmonised assessment of the overall candidate's performance and achievements. Usually, but not necessarily, the first assessor can provide a more complete overview of the candidate's achievements. Based on both assessment forms, the <u>conversion</u> of grades into the Dutch and German grading system and the calculation of the <u>final grade</u> will be done by the <u>examination officer</u> at the first assessor's university. Both exam officers at RU and UDE shall frequently exchange the grades, to ensure the timely graduation at both TWM universities.

Assessment

The assessment is divided into the following items (% contribution to final grade):

- Research (40%): performance and achievements related to the overall research approach.
- Report (40%): structure, content and style/language of the written thesis.
- Presentation (20%): structure, content and defence of the outcome during an oral presentation.

Both assessors can objectively assess the written report and shall complete at least the report section of this assessment form. Often, both assessors are also involved in the set-up of a master project. If both assessors accompanied this progress, both shall also judge on the overall research approach and the candidate's progress, and complete the research section accordingly. The final presentation shall be assessed by the assessor(s) present during the presentation.

Assessment

Important: Dutch and German assessors are requested to enter grades according to their national grading system. This is a numerical value between 5.5 and 10.0 (10.0 is the best, 0.5 steps) in the Netherlands and between 1.0 and 4.0 (1.0 is the best; 0.3 and 0.7 steps) in Germany. Any conversion between both systems shall be made by the exam officers only!
