Tuition Fee waiver spots for Radboud University

As a partner of the University of Leicester, Radboud University can offer our students 1 spots at their Summer Schools with a Tuition Fee Waiver. The following conditions apply to this fee waiver

Conditions

- The scholarship will be in the form of a fee waiver for a specific International Summer Programme. Please ensure the applicant has received an offer for the International Summer Programme they are interested in before submitting a scholarship application.
- The participant will be liable for all other costs of attending the International Summer Programme, such as for travel, subsistence, visas and insurance. The scholarship is not valid for any other University of Leicester course.
- The applicant must meet the entry requirements for the course being applied for.
 Relevant documents of successful applicants will be checked before an invitation letter is sent.
- The scholarship is only valid for 2025 International Summer Programmes. It cannot be deferred by the applicant until a subsequent academic year.
- No cash alternatives will be offered and the scholarship cannot be transferred to any other course at the University of Leicester.
- Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the University of Leicester and the decision of the judging panel is final.
- The University of Leicester reserves the right to revise, review or withdraw the scholarship up to the point of invitation if the applied for course is no longer run. The student will be informed in advance of this decision at the earliest opportunity.

In case you are interested in this fee waiver spot, please send an email to studentexchange@ru.nl and attach your Transcript of Records and a motivation letter for taking part in one of these Summer Schools. The deadline to apply for a tuition fee waiver spot is 1 June 2025.

After this deadline, team Student Life and International Mobility (SLIM) will inform the student who have been selected for the fee waiver spot as soon as possible. Radboud

University nominates these students at University of Leicester for the fee waiver spot and the student then still needs to apply for the programme they want to take part in themselves.

English for Humanities International Summer Programme

Discover British literature and history and develop your English skills at the University of Leicester.

Aims

The main aims of this three-week course are to help participants improve their ability in both general and academic English, while also learning more about humanities subjects offered by the University of Leicester in enjoyable surroundings. It also aims to give participants an insight into life in the UK and its higher education system.

Course contents

 Daily English classes, focusing on both general and academic English, with particular emphasis on speaking and listening skills

- A mixture of seminars and lectures on British culture, focusing on film studies, museum studies and English literature, with particular emphasis on Shakespeare and the discovery of the remains of King Richard III
- An individual research project and poster presentation
- Three day trips to places of interest such as London, Oxford and Stratford-upon-Avon
- Three evening social activities with students from other international summer programmes: a welcome meal, cultural or social event, and a farewell party
- Some free time, making it possible to visit other cities or places of interest independently
- An end-of-course presentation ceremony and tutor feedback

What is the difference between Leicester Discovery International Summer Programme and English for Humanities International Summer Programme?

The English for Humanities International Summer Programme requires a higher English level (IELTS 5.0 and above) and contains more academic content. It is most suitable for those who wish to develop an established interest in the humanities, in areas such as British literature and history.

The Leicester Discovery International Summer Programme aims to offer a general introduction to British life and culture. Although there are clear academic themes within course, there is more of focus on activities outside the classroom than with the English for Humanities International Summer Programme. It requires a lower IELTS level of 3.5 - 5.0.

English for Medics International Summer Programme

The English for Medics International Summer Programme is ideal for medical students and health professionals who want to improve their English for use in a hospital or medical setting. The course has been running for over seventeen years and was initially devised with the support of a University of Leicester alumnus who is now a doctor in Japan.

Aims

The main aims of the course are to develop participants' ability to communicate when using English for medical purposes and to provide them with opportunities to find out about the health system and medical practice in the UK. We focus on all four language skills – speaking, listening, reading and writing but the main emphasis will be on improving spoken English. An important aspect of the course is to learn to communicate in an appropriate way. When health professionals communicate with patients, they are expected to have a good 'bedside manner'.

Why join the English for Medics International Summer Programme?

Course description

This intensive course primarily focuses on language used in medical contexts. Participants will be provided with opportunities to use new medical vocabulary and structures in different contexts such as with a patient or consulting with fellow health professionals.

The strands of the course are:

- Medical research project, culminating in the presentation of an academic poster at a research exhibition
- Patient consultation, culminating in an assessed consultation
- Guest lectures and seminars from healthcare professionals
- Classes exploring contemporary UK health issues

As an indication, some of the topics covered in the healthcare lectures and seminars have previously included:

- Genetics
- Perspectives from a general practitioner (GP)
- Perspectives from an emergency doctor
- Perspectives from a local medical student
- Palliative care
- Introduction to the National Health Service (history, structure, challenges, future)
- Midwifery
- Physiotherapy
- Molecular and cell biology (developments in diabetes research)
- International medical education approaches

Leicester Discovery International Summer Programme

The Leicester Discovery International Summer Programme is aimed at students of all disciplines who wish to experience a taste of studying at a British university whilst learning about life in the UK and improving their English and academic skills.
