

RSS02.B2 Ethnographic Methods: From Fieldwork to Textwork detailed program

Day 1:

The course begins on Day 1 by reviewing what makes ethnographic/interpretivist methods distinctive and the methodological implications, including the centrality of writing as a method, before considering the essential characteristics of ethnographic/interpretivist writing.

Day 2:

we turn our attention to the processes of beginning to “make sense” of field data and explore the different deskwork strategies that can be employed to identify key themes and issues.

Day 3:

sees us reflect on the challenges of representation when writing and how to navigate the multiple (and often conflicting) demands placed on researchers, continuing on **Day 4** to examine how to write trustworthy ethnographic/interpretivist research.

Day 5

The course concludes by looking at writing for different audiences and outlets, and invites participants to reflect on their plans for the deskwork and textwork phases of their projects.
