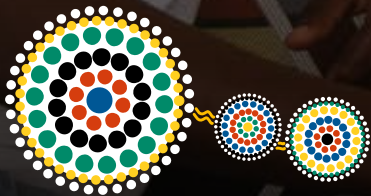

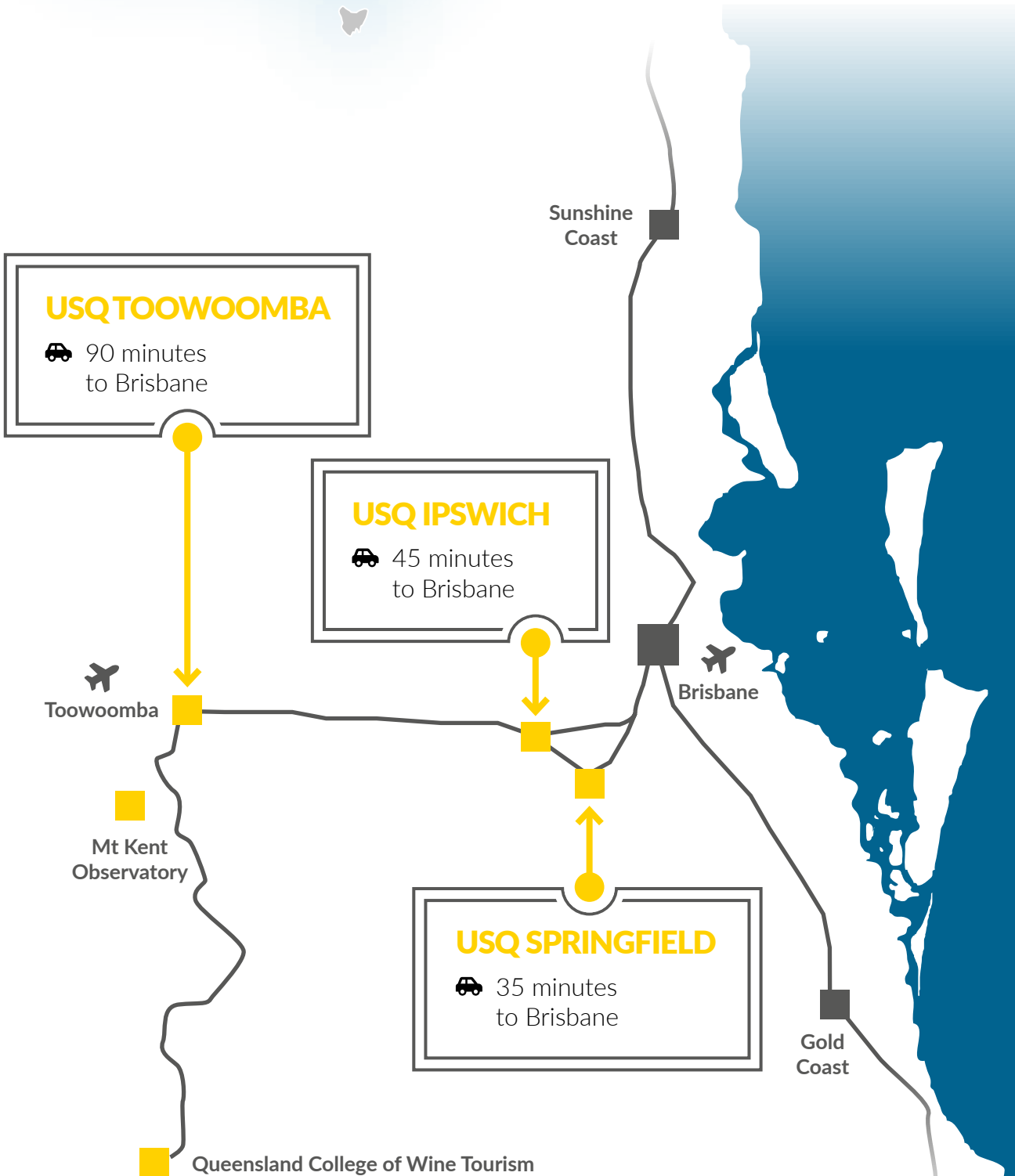

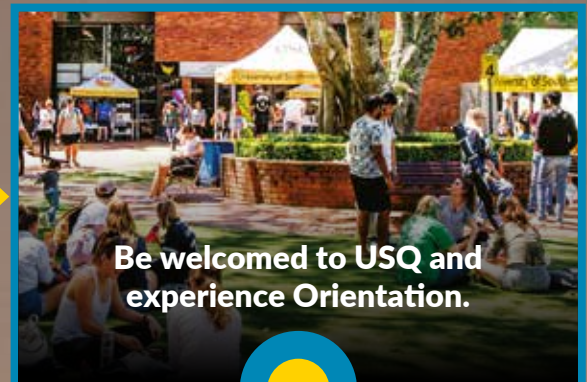

Accommodation

Live on-campus with us

USQ Residential Colleges accommodation is a great choice for students who want an on-campus living experience. We offer different catering options, flexible payment options, organised social and sporting events, as well as exclusive accommodation scholarships.

McGregor College

Our largest college with around 200 rooms offers you a variety of living options with private flats as well as rooms with shared ensuites between two people, and self-catered kitchen facilities.

Steele Rudd College

This home away from home was recently refurbished. Its modern, light and airy appearance makes your study life a dream and inspires your daily activities. The college offers nearly 120 bedrooms with shared bathrooms.

Concannon College

This 100 bed double story accommodation block has the option of bedrooms with private or shared bathrooms. It also offers students a variety of unique study spaces.

Convenience

Included in the price of accommodation are utilities, unlimited internet, parking, a strong support network and much more. Colleges have a team who regularly clean your bathroom and the common areas, while almost half of the private bedrooms also have air-conditioning. There is 24-hour security that provides general security services and assists you if you're locked out (at no charge). Colleges offer flexible agreements, with contracts based on academic semesters and the option to vacate during recess periods (free storage available).

Choice

There are a variety of room types and catering packages to choose from, with the different options varying in price. From private ensuites to shared bathrooms and self-catered to three cooked meals per day, the choice is yours. For prepared meals, you have the choice of 7, 14 and 21 meals per week, with all dietary requirements and allergies catered for. Our self-catered facilities have access to a full kitchen, including: ovens, microwaves, fridges, basic kitchen appliances and personal draws for storing food items and utensils.

All of our rooms are single occupancy private rooms, and include: a king single bed, desk and built-in cupboards. All of our blocks have a designated common room, and each college also has a Recreation Hall, Dining Hall and complimentary washing facilities.



Community

We offer a comprehensive support network to help you both academically and personally. We have Resident Advisors (RAs) allocated to each college who form the basis of the support network, acting as the first port of call for any concerns. We also have a College Wellness Educator available to enhance the health and wellbeing of the college community. Peer support starts from day one, with the Student Transition and Engagement Program (STEP) where new students receive mentoring from returning students.

Colleges can enhance your student experience and broaden your employability skills, with events, cultural and sporting activities, leadership opportunities and so much more. You have the opportunity to make an incredible group of friends, which starts right from Orientation with a variety of activities to assist in your transition to USQ. The Resident Student Club (RSC) are student leaders who plan semi-formals/formal dinners, the weekly sport competition (Res Shield), social events and community activities through the year.

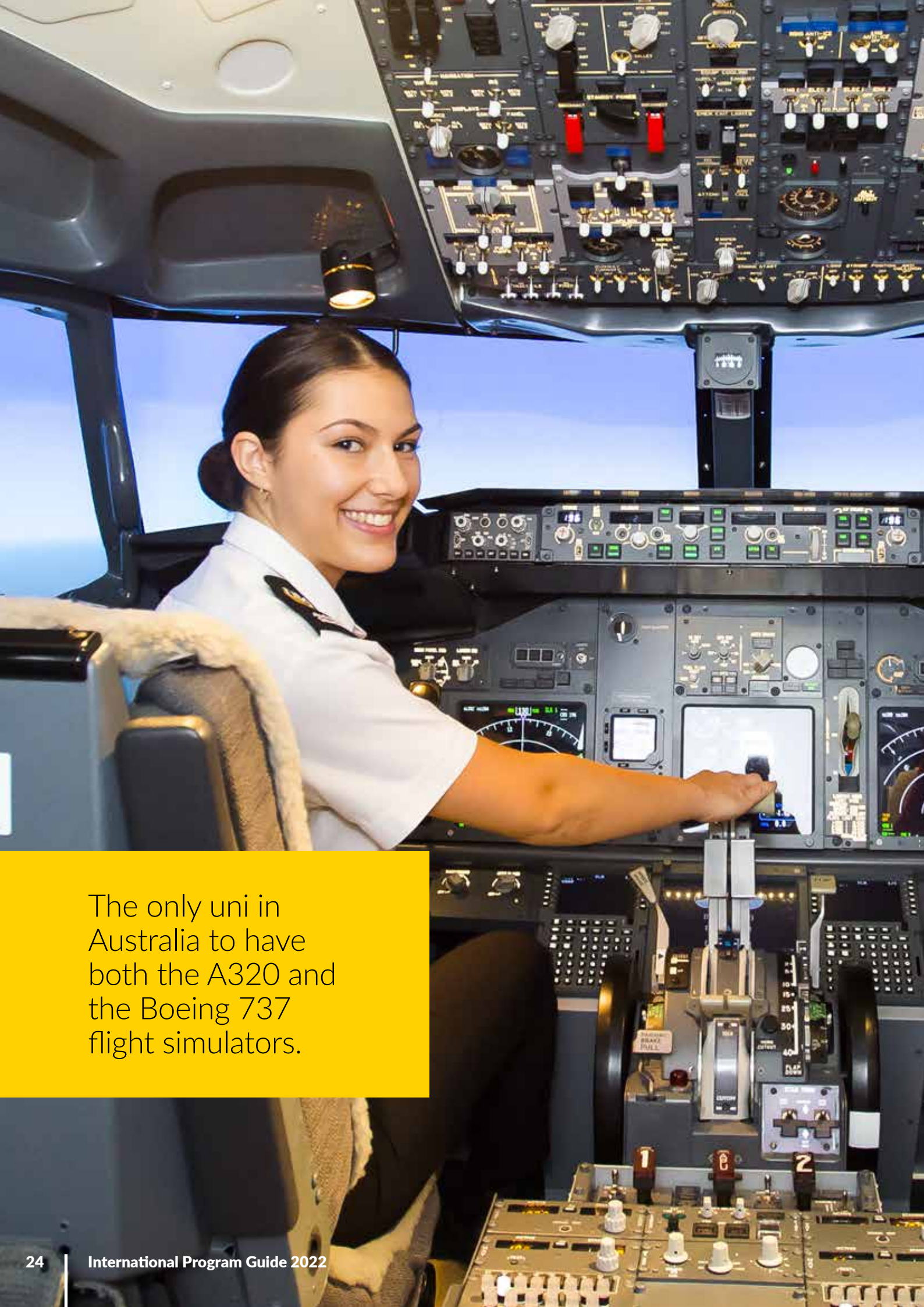

Graduates of the Bachelor of Aviation (Flight Operations) program will gain professional pilot qualifications issued by the Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority.

- 1 Upon graduation, students may have the opportunity to apply for entry into the Qantas Group Future Pilot Program. Please refer to the Qantas website for entry requirements.
- 2 Students intending to undertake the Flight Operations major will be required to co-enrol with a specified flight training school at additional cost. Please contact USQ for further information on the application process.

Employers from certain countries and airlines may require an Australian Commercial Pilot Licence to be converted or transferred, and may prescribe other requirements or qualifications as necessary. While this is not an admission requirement to the program, students planning to undertake the Flight Operations major will have to hold a Class 1 Medical Certificate issued by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority, as this is one of the regulatory requirements to hold a Commercial Pilot Licence. In addition, students in the Flight Operations major are expected to complete a recognised pilot aptitude assessment and interview prior to being allowed to undertake the Flight Operations major. Appropriate advice will be provided to students during the first academic year.

Professional accreditation

Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major graduates will meet the educational entrance requirements of CPA Australia and Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CAANZ). This provides Associate membership of CPA Australia, eligibility to study the CPA Australia professional exams and eligibility to study the CAANZ professional exams.

The Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major are accredited by the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA) and the Association of International Accountants (AIA).

Successful completion of the Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major can qualify students for exemptions from the Fundamental level (9 papers) of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) exams.

Accounting major and Accounting (Extended) major students who complete a Finance minor will meet the educational entrance requirements of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (Finsia).

Students who wish to be registered tax agents must complete the Accounting (Extended) major and complete LAW3444 Competition and Consumer Law as an elective in order to meet the educational entrance requirements of the Tax Practitioners Board.


Finance major graduates will meet the educational entrance requirements to become a member of the Financial Services Institute of Australasia (Finsia).

The Human Resource Management major is accredited by the Australian Human Resources Institute (AHRI) and satisfies the educational requirements for professional membership of AHRI.


The Marketing major is accredited by the Australian Marketing Institute (AMI), and students are eligible for credit towards becoming a Certified Practising Marketer (CPM) upon completion.
