



pre-Master's regulations - Nijmegen School of Management

Academic Year: 2023-2024



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Paragraph 1 General provisions

Article 1 Purpose of the regulations

In these pre-Master's regulations (hereinafter: regulations) the current procedures and rights and obligations have been laid down for pre-Master's students. These programmes are offered by the faculty of Management Sciences of Radboud University.

Article 2 Scope of the regulations

1. The regulations apply for all students who are registered in the academic year 2023-2024 for the programmes referred to in article 1.
2. The regulations in appendix 2 apply to students who are registering for enrollment in the academic year 2023-2024.

Article 3 Definitions

1. The terms in these regulations that are also used in the Higher Education and Research Act (*Wet op het hoger onderwijs en wetenschappelijk onderzoek*; hereinafter to be referred to as 'the Act') have the same meaning as these terms have in the Act.
2. Notwithstanding the provisions in clause 1 of the present article, the following terms have the following meanings:
 - a. Specialisation: variant within the study programme.
 - b. Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students: an individually-tailored programme for university students who are taking or have completed an academic Bachelor's degree programme or an academic Master's degree programme that does not link up sufficiently with the intended programme and must therefore complete several subjects in which they are deficient.
 - c. Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students: a course of study that is taken during or after a relevant degree programme in Higher Professional Education (HBO) that gives students the opportunity to prepare for a specific Master's programme of the Faculty.
 - d. Bridging programme: a programme comprising a prescribed curriculum of courses from both an academic Bachelor's degree programme from outside the Faculty and courses from a Bachelor's degree programme within the Faculty that gives students the opportunity to prepare for a Master's degree programme of the Faculty.
 - e. Certificate: proof of the completion of the Pre-Master's programme that will be made available at the request of the student.
3. Where these regulations refer to 'the student', the prospective student is included, wherever relevant.

Article 4 Registration for the programme

1. The executive board registers the student who meets the admission requirements and procedures set for registration as pre-Master's student at Radboud University, as referred to and described in the Registration Regulations of Radboud University.
2. For further information, the requirements and procedures referred to in clause 1 have been attached to these regulations as appendix I.



Article 5 Decision on admission

The Examination Committee decides, on behalf of the executive board, on the student's admission to a pre-Master's programme.

Article 6 Preparatory programmes

1. Students who are taking a Bachelor's or Master's degree programme at a university other than the programmes, or who have completed these programmes, can take a Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students to obtain admission to the Master's programme or specialization. When the Pre-Master's programme has been passed, students are granted admission to the corresponding Master's programme if they have also earned the degree certificate for a Bachelor's or Master's programme as referred to above.
 - a. Enrolment as a premaster student is subject to the admission requirements and procedures referred in Article 4.
2. Students who have fully completed a relevant study programme at a University of Applied Sciences (HBO), can take a Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students provided that they comply with the admission requirements referred to in Article 4. When the Pre-Master's programme has been passed, students are granted admission to the corresponding Master's programme.
3. Based on the conditions in the programme-specific part of these Regulations, students can enrol in the bridging programmes in Law and Management and Law and Economics. Students can enrol in the corresponding Master's degree programme after these programmes are successfully completed and after the Bachelor's degree programme in Dutch Law is completed and the course Recht, arbeid en management (Law, Labour and Management) is passed.
4. The Pre-Master's programme and the bridging programmes are described in detail in the programme-specific part of these Regulations.
5. Students who have passed a Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students receive at their request a certificate that provides admission to the subsequent Masters programme, on the condition that they have enrolled as a Pre-Master's student; otherwise they receive proof of admission to the subsequent Master's programme.
6. Students who have passed the bridging programmes in Law and Management or Law and Economics (including the prerequisites of the Faculty of Law), receive at their request a certificate that provides admission to the subsequent Master's programme or Master's specialisation.
7. Students who have successfully completed a Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students, also receive at their request a certificate that provides admission to the subsequent Master's programme or Master's specialisation.

Article 7 HBO Pre-Master's programme taken partially in advance

1. As part of a relevant HBO degree programme, students can take a maximum of five courses from the HBO Pre-Master's programme in advance. Whether this possibility exists, which courses it entails and whether there is a required sequence, are specified in the programme-specific part of these Regulations.
2. The applicable admission requirements and procedures for admission to the advanced hbo premaster are attached as Appendix I.
3. After they earn their HBO diploma, based on the provisions in clauses 1 and 2, the students are directly admissible to the remaining portion of the Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students.



Article 8 HBO Pre-Master's programme taken entirely in advance

1. At certain HBO institutions, students in a relevant HBO study programme can take the entire HBO Pre-Master's programme during their HBO study; in these cases, the HBO Pre-Master's programme is taken entirely in advance. For each degree programme, the programme-specific part of these Regulations specifies these HBO institutions, the structure of the Pre-Master's programme and whether the courses must be taken in a specific sequence.
2. If an HBO Pre-Master's programme that is taken entirely in advance prepares students for certain Master's specialisations, then the programme-specific part of these Regulations specifies which HBO Pre-Master's programmes correspond with which Master's specialisations.
3. The conditions for admission to the HBO Pre-Master's programme that is taken entirely in advance are specified in the programme-specific part of these Regulations.
4. All students who want to take the HBO Pre-Master's programme entirely in advance, as referred to in clause 1, must also present a statement of consent from the HBO degree programme and a statement of consent from the Examining Board of the corresponding degree programme of the Faculty.
5. After they earn their HBO diploma, and meet all requirements of the HBO Pre-Master's programme, students are directly admissible to the Master's programme or specialization based on the provisions in clauses 1-4.

Article 9 Safety net scheme and hardship clause

1. In cases not covered by these regulations, or insufficiently covered by these regulations, the dean decides.
2. In individual cases and on the basis of exceptional circumstances, the Examining Board is authorised to make a decision that deviates from these Regulations. This decision must not limit the rights of the student as set down in these Regulations.
3. In the event these regulations differ from those in the applicable statutory stipulations, the provisions in the Act prevail.

Article 10 Adoption, employee participation and amendments

1. These regulations are laid down or amended by the dean, after the faculty joint assembly (facultaire gemeenschappelijke vergadering) has delivered its opinion on them.
2. Programme committee's (opleidingscommissie) are annually given the opportunity to advise the Dean on these regulations.
3. Amendments to these regulations do not take effect in the current academic year, unless the interests of the student are not disproportionately compromised by it.

Article 11 Transitional arrangement

1. Students are entitled to a transitional arrangement if a unit of study is no longer offered.
2. The transitional arrangement for a unit of study that is no longer offered includes in any case at least two opportunities to resit the corresponding interim examination and possibly the option of taking a substitute unit to replace the unit of study that is no longer offered, also with two opportunities to resit the corresponding interim examination. For each academic year, students may participate in a maximum of two of the possible four opportunities to resit an interim examination that arise from such a transitional arrangement.



Article 12 Implementation

1. These regulations enter into effect on 1 September 2021.
2. The pre-Master's regulation laid down previously cease to have effect as from that date.

Article 13 Publication

1. The dean is responsible for the appropriate publication of these regulations and of any amendments of them.
2. Any interested party is entitled to inspect a copy of these regulations at the Student Information Point (STIP) of the faculty.
3. The regulations will be published in both Dutch and English. In case of a conflict between the two versions, the Dutch version takes precedence.

Article 14 Evaluation

The dean ensures that these regulations are evaluated on a regular basis.

These regulations were adopted by the dean on behalf of the board on 31 August 2022



Paragraph 2 Pre-Master's programme for the Master in Business Administration & Bridging programme Law and Management

Article 15 Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students

1. As part of the admission regulations for the Master's degree programme, the Examining Board can grant admission to a Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students to students who are taking a Bachelor's or Master's degree programme at a Dutch university other than the programmes referred to in clause 2, or who have completed these programmes.
2. The Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students is intended for students who have a Bachelor's or Master's degree other than Bedrijfskunde/Business Administration; this Pre-Master's programme has a maximum magnitude of 60 ECs. The Examining Board can grant exemptions for one or more components.
3. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Business Administration apply to the Pre-Master: Admission to tuition and examinations, for examination, with the exception of Article 11, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 35 and 36, Study progress, counselling and recommendations, with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.
4. The Pre-Master's programme consists of the following courses:

Article 16 Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students

1. As part of the admission regulations for the Master's degree programme, the Examining Board can grant admission to the Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students to students with a relevant HBO degree certificate.



2. The Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students has a magnitude of 60 ECs.
3. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Business Administration apply to the Pre-Master: Admission to tuition and examinations, or examination, with the exception of Article 11, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 35 and 36, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.
4. The Pre-Master's programme consists of the following courses:

Article 17 Language of instruction of the Pre-Master's programme for university/HBO transfer students

1. The language of instruction in the Pre-Master is English.
2. The language of instruction of tuition and exams may deviate from the language of instruction of the pre-Master's.

Article 18 Pre-Master's programme taken entirely in advance

1. Students who have been selected by HAN University of Applied Sciences from the degree programmes of the Faculty of Economics and Management (FEM) referred to in the relevant agreement can take a Pre-Master's programme entirely in advance, as referred to in Article 8 of these Regulations.
2. The Pre-Master's programme taken entirely in advance consists of an academic curriculum (30 ECs) of courses from the Bachelor's degree programme in Business Administration for the FEM Talent Academy minor (FEMTA minor), and an extracurricular FEMTA programme of 30 ECs offered by the HAN University of Applied Sciences.
3. HBO students in the FEM degree programmes referred to in the relevant agreement can enrol in the FEMTA minor if they meet the following prerequisites:



- a. at the beginning of the FEMTA minor they have earned 180 ECs or the equivalent, or can earn a total of 180 ECs during the current academic year
 - b. they are students in the extracurricular programme of FEMTA
 - c. they have not incurred a study delay in the FEMTA curriculum
 - d. they comply with the language requirements for Pre-Master's students, as specified in Article 4 clause 4 of these Regulations
 - e. they have received permission to enrol in the Pre-Master's programme from the Examining Board that has jurisdiction over the Bachelor's degree programme of the HAN University of Applied Sciences
 - f. they have received permission to enrol in the Pre-Master's programme from the Business Administration Examining Board of Radboud University.
4. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Business Administration apply to the Pre-Master: Admission to tuition and examinations, with the exception of Article 11, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 35 and 36, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.
 5. There is one intake period for the FEMTA-minor, in February.
 6. Students are admissible to the Master's programme in Business Administration if:
 - a. the FEMTA-minor and the extracurricular FEMTA programme have been completed successfully
 - b. the final paper which concludes the FEMTA programme is assessed with a passing mark by a member of staff (who holds a PhD) of the Master's programme in Business Administration
 - c. the final HBO degree certificate has been awarded.
 7. The assessment of the final paper that concludes the FEMTA programme, as referred to in clause 6, expires if the Pre-Master's programme taken entirely in advance is not successfully completed within two years.
 8. The components of the Pre-Master's programme FEMTA minor are as follows:

1. As part of the admission regulations for the Master's degree programme, the Examining Board can grant admission to the Pre-Master's programme that is taught in English to students who have completed a relevant degree programme at a university or institute of higher professional education abroad.
2. Students with a relevant diploma can be requested to take a GMAT.
3. The Pre-Master's programme that is taught in English has a magnitude of 60 ECs.
4. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Business Administration apply to the Pre-Master: Admission to tuition and examinations with the exception of Article 11, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 35 and 36, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.

Article 21 Language of instruction of the Pre-Master's programme for students with a non-dutch previous education

The language of instruction of the Pre-Master is English.

Article 22 Bridging programme in Law and Management

1. The bridging programme in Law and Management (L&M) has a magnitude of 72 ECs.
2. Students will be admitted to the interim examinations for the courses in semester 2.1 and subsequent semesters:
 - a. when all courses from the first year of the degree programme in Law (Nederlands Recht) have been passed, along with the courses Introduction to Business Administration 1, Introduction to Business Administration 2 and Research and Intervention Methodology A (R&M).
 - b. when they, after taking the resits, have no more than one failing mark of 5. This means that students with one mark lower than 5 or more than one mark of 5 will not be admitted.
3. During semesters 3.2 or 4.1, students must take a preselection course, which depends on the chosen Master's specialisation. A preselection course is prescribed for each Master's specialisation. These are:
 - a. Introduction to Organisation Design for the Master's specialization in OD&D
 - b. Marketing for the Master's specialisations in Marketing and Strategic Management
 - c. Strategic Human Resource Management for the Master's specialisations in SHRL and GEM
 - d. one of these three courses for the Master's specialisations in International Business and Innovation and Entrepreneurship
 - e. Business Analysis for Responsible Organisations for the Master's specialization in Business Analysis and Modelling.
4. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Business Administration apply to the Pre-Master's programme: Admission to tuition and examinations, Registration and deregistration for examination, with the exception of Article 11, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with



the exception of Article 35 and 36, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.

Article 24 Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students

1. As part of the admission regulations for the Master's degree programme, the Examining Board can grant admission to a Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students to students who are taking a Bachelor's or Master's degree programme other than the programmes referred to in clause 2, or who have completed these programmes.
2. The Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students is intended for students who have a Bachelor's or Master's degree other than Public Administration; this Pre-Master's programme has a maximum magnitude of 60 ECs.
3. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Public Administration apply to the Pre-Master's programme: Admission to tuition and examinations, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 34 and 35, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.
4. The premaster for university graduates consists of the following units of study, subject to the discretion of the examination board to determine a tailor-made programme. The programme that has to be completed is indicated in the admission decision.

Article 25 Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students

1. As part of the admission regulations for the Master's degree programme, the Examining Board can grant admission to the Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students to students with a relevant HBO degree certificate.
2. The Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students is identical to the programme laid down in article 25 clause 5 of these regulations. Notwithstanding the discretion of the examination board to determine a tailor-made programme.
3. The Pre-Master's programme has a magnitude of 60 ECs.
4. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Public Administration apply the to Pre-Master's programme: Admission to tuition and examinations, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 34 and 35, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.

Article 26 Language of instruction of the Pre-Master's for HBO transfer students

1. The language of instruction is Dutch.
2. The language of units of study may deviate from the language of instruction.

Article 27 Pre-Master's for students with prior education completed abroad

1. As part of the admission regulations for the Master's degree programme, the Examining Board can grant admission to the Pre-Master's programme to students with a relevant university (of applied sciences) degree certificate obtained abroad.
2. The Pre-Master's programme has a magnitude of 60 ECs.
3. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Public Administration apply the to Pre-Master's programme: Admission to tuition and examinations, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 34 and 35, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.
4. The Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students is a tailor-made programme. The examination board determines for each student which units of study this program consists of.
5. The language of instruction is English.

Article 28 Pre-Master's programme taken partially in advance

1. During their HBO degree programme, students can take a maximum of five courses in advance from the Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students, see Article 7.



2. The following paragraphs of the EER Bachelor Public Administration apply to the Pre-Master's programme:
Admission to tuition and examinations, Structure and form of the units of study, Testing and administering examinations, with the exception of Article 34 and 35, Study progress, counselling and recommendations with the exception of Article 39. The Regulation on Fraud is also applicable.

Article 29 Language of instruction of the Pre-Master's programme taken partially in advance

1. The language of instruction is Dutch.
2. The language of units of study may deviate from the language of instruction.

Article 32 Special provisions concerning Pre-Master's programmes for university transfer students

1. Before they can enter the Master's programme, students who are enrolled at a Dutch university (including Radboud University) in a Bachelor's or Master's academic degree programme other than Economics and Business Economics must take at least one Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students as



referred to in Article 6 clause 1. Depending on their specific preparatory education, the Examining Board can determine that a number of deficiencies must first be eliminated prior to admission to the Pre-Master's programme.

Students in the Bachelor's degree programme in Business Administration who have successfully completed the Business Economics specialisation and who want to enrol in the Master's degree programme in Economics or the specialisation in Corporate Finance & Control must first complete two courses from the Pre-Master's programme for the specialisation in Corporate Finance & Control: History of Economics and Investment Management.
4. Students in the Bachelor's degree programme in International Business Administration or the Bachelor's degree programme in Business Administration who have successfully completed the specialisation in Business Administration, and who want to enrol in the Master's degree programme in Economics, must first complete a Pre-Master's programme. But they only have to take the courses that are missing in their Bachelor's degree programme.

Article 33 Special provisions concerning Pre-Master's programmes for HBO transfer students

1. Students with a relevant HBO Bachelor's degree certificate will be admitted to the Pre-Master's programme according to the criteria in appendix 1 article 3.

 - a. at the beginning of the FEMTA minor they have earned 180 ECs or the equivalent, or can earn a total of 180 ECs during the current academic year
 - b. they are students in the extracurricular programme of FEMTA
 - c. they have not incurred a study delay in the FEMTA curriculum
 - d. they comply with the language requirements for Pre-Master's students, as specified in Appendix 1 Article 7.
 - e. they have received permission to enrol in the Pre-Master's programme from the Examining Board that has jurisdiction over the Bachelor's degree programme of the HAN University of Applied Sciences
 - f. they have received permission to enrol in the Pre-Master's programme from the Economics Examining Board of Radboud University
 - g. Students are admissible to the Master's programme in Economics if

Appendix I Admission requirements and -procedures

Article 1 Scope

These regulations apply to students who are register for enrollment in the academic year 2023-2024 for a pre-Master's programme or a bridging programme of the Management Faculty of Radboud University Nijmegen.

Article 2 Admission requirements university transfer students

Students who have completed a Bachelor's or Master's degree programme at a university, can be admitted to a Pre-Master's programme for university transfer students.

Article 3 Admission requirements 'HBO' transfer students

1. Students with a diploma from a fully completed, relevant degree programme at a University of Applied Sciences (HBO), can take a Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students provided that they have earned an unweighted average mark of at least 7.5 for the last 120EC of the HBO programme.
2. Students with a diploma from a fully completed, relevant HBO degree programme who have earned an unweighted average mark of between 7.0 and 7.5 for the last 120 EC of the HBO programme must submit a letter of motivation to the Examining Board. Based on the transcript and the letter of motivation, the Examining Board will decide whether or not they will be admitted.
3. Notwithstanding clause 1 and 2, students with a diploma from a fully completed, relevant HBO degree programme will be admitted to the Pre-Master's programme in Business Administration if they have a GMAT score of 600 or above
4. The Examining Board of the corresponding degree programme determines which HBO degree programmes are relevant.

Article 4 HBO Pre-Master's programme taken partially in advance

1. The following conditions apply to the HBO Pre-Master's programme that is taken in advance:
 - a. In the relevant HBO programme, students have earned at least 150 ECs (or equivalent) with an unweighted average mark of at least 7.5, or
 - b. In the relevant HBO programme, students have earned at least 150 ECs (or the equivalent) with an unweighted average mark between 7.0 and 7.5, and they submit a letter of motivation on the basis of which the Examining Board of the corresponding degree programme of the Faculty decides on their admission.
2. The Examining Board of the corresponding degree programme determines which HBO degree programmes are relevant.
3. In addition, all students referred to in clause 1 must submit the following.
 - a. a declaration of consent from their HBO degree programme
 - b. a declaration of consent from the Examining Board of the HBO degree programme.
4. After they earn their HBO diploma, based on the provisions in clauses 1-3, the students are directly admissible to the remaining portion of the Pre-Master's programme for HBO transfer students.



Article 5 HBO Pre-Master's programme taken entirely in advance

The conditions for admission to a pre-master's programme that's taken entirely in advance are laid down in the programme-specific part of the pre-master's regulations.

Article 6 Admission requirements for students with an international degree

1. The examination board of the degree programme can admit students with a relevant university or university of applied sciences degree completed abroad to a pre-Master's programme.
2. Students with a relevant degree who want to enrol in an English-language pre-master's programme may be asked by the examination board to submit additional certificates.

Article 7 Admission requirements English language

1. Students who enrol in the English-taught pre-Master's programme must have demonstrable proficiency in English. This requirement has been satisfied when the student meets one of the following conditions:
the student
 - a. holds a Dutch pre-university diploma (VWO diploma);
 - b. holds a diploma from a propaedeutic program in Dutch higher professional education (HBO) that is taught entirely in English;
 - c. holds a Bachelor's degree obtained in Dutch higher professional education (HBO);
 - d. holds an International Baccalaureate degree;
 - e. holds a European Baccalaureate degree that includes the course English Language 1 or 2 as a minimum;
 - f. holds a diploma appearing in in appendix VI clause 4 of the Registration Regulations of Radboud University and has also passed the English course in the corresponding curriculum;
 - g. holds a diploma from secondary education equivalent to or higher than Dutch VWO level from an educational institution located in one of the Member States of the EU/EEA, Australia, Canada (excluding Quebec (province)), New Zealand, the United Kingdom, or the United States, for which the language of instruction was English.
2. Students who do not meet one of the above conditions must:
 - a. have earned a TOEFL certificate (iBT) with a total score of at least 80, with subscores of not less than 20;
 - b. have earned an IELTS Academic certificate with a total score of at least 6.0, with subscores of not less than 6.0;
 - c. have earned a Cambridge C1 Advanced certificate with a score of at least C;
 - d. have earned a Cambridge C2 Proficiency certificate with a score of at least C.
3. Other certificates will not be accepted.
4. Certificates must not be older than two years.

Article 8 Time of admission

1. In September, it will be determined whether students on the beginning date of the academic year as established by the administration of the institution have complied with the requirements concerning admission to the degree programme. Students who have not complied with the requirements at that time cannot take exams from the degree programme for that academic year.
2. Contrary to clause 1, in the case of special circumstances the Examination Board may, determine at a later



date whether students met the requirements for admission by 31 August at the latest.

- a. These students are conditionally admitted to educational activities of the pre-Master's programme;
- b. These students may not participate in examinations until it has been definitively established that students had met the admission requirements at the latest by 31 August.
